It was a year ago that we reported that our dear friend Irene (Irene Wright) passed from this life to be with the Lord Jesus forever. We wrote about her home-going in our May 1, 2011 Newsletter, saying,

“Grandma” Irene Wright left this life on 4/24/11 to be forever with the Lord Jesus. She graduated to Glory on late Resurrection Sunday night. We praise our Lord Jesus for allowing us to come to know and love her. She was born and raised in the Mormon Church and she lived as a TBM (true believing Mormon) for 88 years of her life. She received the true Lord Jesus of the Bible in August of 2009 at the age of 88 and she was born again. [Irene Wright-story, just briefly]:

*She had been a temple worker in the Los Angeles LDS Temple till she was 77 years old. She moved to Utah to live with her daughter Jamie and son-in-law Chris Hohnbaum, both of them at that time were also temple active LDS. Soon after “Grandma Irene” had come to live with them, Chris started a discussion with Dennis on **Mormonism vs. Biblical Christianity**. Fairly soon Chris came to the conclusion that Mormonism is a deadly deception, and that the Bible is true – all of it.*

*When Chris shared this information with his wife Jamie and “Grandma Irene”, their relationship became quite stressed - to say the least. Their strained relationship continued nearly 12 years – until the 19th of June of 2009, when Jamie finally agreed that perhaps she needed to see the documented evidence that had caused her husband to abandon Mormonism and come to **the cross of Jesus alone** for his salvation – and becoming a born again Christian. [It was on 6/19/09 when Chris and Jamie came to “inspect” our library of hundreds of LDS books and documentations and ask questions.]*

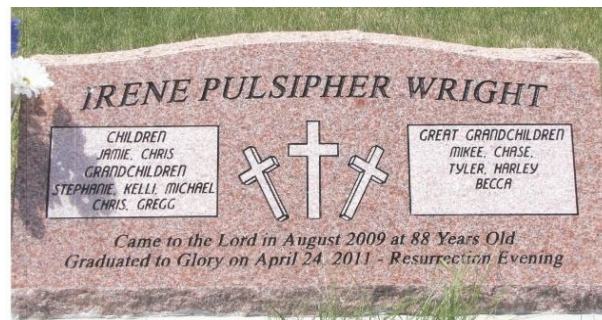
*Isaiah 1:18 commands that we “**reason together**” rather than rely on subjective feelings for “truth”, and this reasoning is what brought Jamie to realize who Jesus really is –that He is not our brother as is taught in Mormonism, but Almighty God who loved us so much that He became a man to save all who would come to Him... (Rev. 1:8; Matt. 1:23; John 1:1, 14; 8:23-24; 3:16; 20:28.)*

*When Jamie and Chris finally left our house that June evening, her comment to her husband was, “**What am I going to say to my mom?**” Truth and reason had already won her mind, and within a couple weeks Jamie received Jesus of the Bible as her Lord and Savior and became a born again child of God. (John 1:12.) She immediately became very concerned about her elderly mother’s eternal life and through a lot of prayer and their*

loving witness to her mom from the Word of God, **Grandma Irene** also received Jesus and was born again in August of 2009.

About a month later, in September 2009, Jamie and Chris, with Grandma Irene, enrolled in our “Understanding Mormonism” class at Calvary Chapel. They attended our classes every Sunday night for all 12 weeks and were amazed with what they did not know about the religion they had spent their lifetime in. As Grandma Irene learned more about the true history of Joseph Smith, and his deceptive creation of the Book of Mormon and the Book of Abraham, of his marriages to **eleven already married women and under-aged girls from 14 to 17 years old**, in addition to scores of other women, Grandma Irene commented with a sigh “**Oh that darn Joseph Smith! What a deceiver he was!**” During the coming weeks, between classes, Grandma Irene read and reread all the lesson materials and LDS documentation pertaining to these discussions. She was also eagerly studying her **KJV Study Bible** we had given to her as her “birthday gift” when she was reborn. Irene was very excited about learning the Bible and she often expressed her thankfulness to the Lord who had allowed her to live until she found the true Jesus. [From the time she was born again till she passed away she had read the Bible 3 times, all the way through.] We know that she is now with the Lord in heaven (2 Cor. 5:8), waiting for all of us to come there too. We are also very happy that her testimony is even on video, as she, with Jamie, were guests (March 17th 2011) on Doris Hanson’s weekly TV show on polygamy, ‘**What Love Is This?**’ This was just about 5 weeks before her passing. We are sad not having grandma Irene with us now, but we are happy that she is safely with the Lord.”

Grandma Irene had lamented that due to her high age (89) and poor health, she may not have many opportunities to make the Lord known to others and bring them to the knowledge that salvation is *the gift of God, not of works* (Eph. 2:8-10). Jamie and Chris had promised to make “grandma Irene’s” testimony known. Now, everyone visiting the Herriman Cemetery will see her tombstone as they exit from there. It declares her testimony: ‘IT IS ALL ABOUT JESUS’. You also see what else she had discovered – i.e. that “Joseph Lied”. Her headstone points out where the readers could go to find more information, www.hismin.com, as a source of her knowledge that brought her out of Mormonism. They can also see some of the scriptures that meant a lot to her.



Just a short time ago we received this email:

*“Hello! I just wanted to send an email to you about how I came across your website. I was at the Herriman Cemetery where I was placing flowers on my families headstones for Resurrection Day and while I was there I looked around to see all of the headstones with Temples and LDS sayings and thought to myself... Lord, how sad that all of these people lived their lives in vain for this false religion and now they stand before you as a stranger... I left very saddened and honestly sickened by the LDS religion and I as I drove away there was a headstone that read “It’s all about Jesus” and I had to stop. That’s where I found the grave for **Irene Pulsipher Wright** with your website on it and I was blown away! What an awesome woman she must have been and what a great*

idea for a headstone! To think she is still being used as a witness although she is in the presence of the Lord!

Just to share a little about myself... I too was raised in the LDS religion. My parents met on my Dad's LDS mission, were married in the SL Temple and my sister and I were baptized at 8. In 1993 at the age of 10 my sister died from heart disease and it was very hard on my family. After the death of my sister it caused my Dad to look deeply into our beliefs. After much study of the Book of Mormon and the Bible my Dad realized the **JESUS IS GOD** and nothing in the Book of Mormon was lining up. He took me and my Mom out of the church when I was 15 and then held weekly Bible studies at home with me because he really didn't know what to do after leaving. When I was 20 I got engaged and my Dad found **Calvary Chapel SLC** for my husband and I where we gave our hearts to the Lord and have been walking with him ever since ☺. That was 10 years ago now and I am so thankful to have a relationship with Jesus! Sadly in 2005 at the age of 50 my Dad was killed on his motorcycle and in 2009 my Mom at the age of 51 died from kidney failure from Diabetes and their graves are at the Herriman Cemetery. I thank God for using my Dad to let me know Him and that my parents knew Jesus before they died.

Praise God for your website and for what you guys are doing! This valley needs Jesus and the false religion of Mormonism needs to be radically brought to light. I will keep you all in my prayers :) God Bless you all!!!! J.C.”

[Grandma Irene's testimony of the true Jesus and encouragement to seek the truth from God's Word, the Bible, is being noticed. Not that we expect everyone to write us about it, but it was wonderful to hear this. Thank you, J.C.]

The much talked about issue of the blacks and the priesthood may not be news to you any more, at least here in Utah, for this has been reported in the papers and news during the last 1-2 months, but we want to also go on record about this. Many Mormons have said (after 1978) that **“this doctrine must have come from Brigham Young because he was a racist, and not from Joseph Smith, who had ordained a black man to the priesthood!”** Yes, he may have done that, but lets look at what he still thought and said about the matter of a black race. (From the **History of the Church** by Joseph Smith, vol. 5, pp. 218-219), I quote his own words: “Had I anything to do with the negro, I would confine them by strict law to their own species and put them on a national equalization.” Joseph set the standard. Since then Mormon “prophets and apostles” have taught, nearly 150 years, that a dark skin was/is a sign of a divine curse. In the Book of Mormon (2 Nephi 5:20-21), published in 1830, we read that only a few years after they had arrived on this American Continent, **“...because of their iniquity...the Lord God did cause a skin of blackness to come upon them”.** However, **Lamanites**’ (American Indians) skin color curse did not need be permanent! A **reverse** is promised in the BoM – i.e. if they repent, their skin color would turn back to “white and delightful”. (2 Ne.30:6.) Perhaps for that reason dark skinned **Lamanites** were allowed to receive the LDS Priesthood, **but not so for the black race, who, for 148 years, could not have the priesthood nor could they go to a Mormon temple.** Records of the Mormon Church show that **their prophets and apostles,** from Joseph Smith on till 1978, have taught that priesthood denial was **“the Lord’s doing, and not from man”** and that it is based on what those, born into the black race, did or did not do in the preexistence.

They have taught that ***the Lord put a mark on him (Cain), because he had killed his brother Abel. They teach that this “mark is the flat nose and black skin.”*** (Journal of Discourses, vol.13:95.). Not only have LDS prophets taught that, but their scripture, ***Pearl of Great Price (Moses 5:30-31) teaches that Cain had made a covenant with Satan, and “the seed of Cain were black”.*** (Moses 7:8, 22.) ***John Taylor, the Third President of the LDS Church, taught about the black race, saying “...after the flood we are told that the curse that had been pronounced upon Cain was continued through Ham’s wife, as he had married a wife of that seed. And why did it pass through the flood? Because it was necessary that the devil should have a representation upon the earth as well as God...”*** (JoD, Vol. 22:304.) From the ***PoGP***, in the Book of Abraham, we read (1:21-27)“***...and thus, from Ham, sprang that race which preserved the curse in the land... [and they were] cursed as pertaining to the Priesthood.***”

In June of 1978 Mormons accepted a “***revelation from God***” informing them that God had changed his mind and now allows blacks this privilege of receiving the priesthood. ***Thus came a change in doctrine.***

Now, almost 34 years later, on March 1, 2012, the Mormon Church announced that this denial of priesthood for the blacks was never doctrine at all, just folk-belief, and that it was never taught as doctrine by their leaders - and if it was, maybe just “by one leader on a single occasion” had presented it as ‘his personal opinion.’ (So said an LDS Apostle D. Todd Christofferson in the LDS General Conference, April 1, 2012, as reported in The Salt Lake Tribune, April 2, 2012.)

We are wondering how do the LDS people justify this current denial concerning ***blacks and the priesthood doctrine that was taught 148 years by their leadership*** in light of these teachings still found in their scriptures, and what their ***prophets and apostles***, since the days of Joseph Smith, have taught and written volumes about? Certainly it cannot truthfully be said to have been only “***an opinion of one single leader on a single occasion***”, as was said in the General Conference (4/1/12)!

We wonder how do those Mormons who were adults, or even teenagers in 1978, take this “***folklore***” announcement? If you had asked, prior to 1978, any LDS leader or member (as we were then also), ***is the denial of the priesthood to the blacks doctrine from God, they/we would have said, “yes, absolutely”***, for their prophets and apostles have spoken about that in their General Conferences, and written about it in their magazines and books ***for 148 years.***

Mormon Doctrine, p. 527-528, 1966 ed. said, “***The negroes are not equal with other races where the receipt of certain spiritual blessings are concerned, particularly the priesthood and the temple blessings that flow therefrom, but this inequality is not of man’s origin. It is the Lord’s doing, is based on his eternal laws of justice, and grows out of the lack of spiritual valiance of those concerned in their first estate.***” (underline added.) [To Mormons “first estate” is preexistence.]

This new statement that ***it never was doctrine***, seems to be a clear admission that the LDS Church has not had “***prophets***” or “***apostles***” leading their Church, and thus their scriptures teaching this doctrine are not from God either. Based on this, we can expect that what LDS “***prophets***” and “***apostles***” teach today, and if it later becomes unpopular, they could similarly dismiss it/them as just an “opinion” or “folklore”... But when god Mormons believe in is a former mortal man, this can be expected. (They should read Ps. 118:8 and realize the obvious fallacy of Mormonism.) However, what they have taught and what they teach now, comes with an assurance found in the D&C, promising that, “***The Lord will never permit me or any other man who stands as President of this Church to lead you astray... It is not in the mind of God. If I were to attempt that, the Lord would remove me out of my place, and so***

He will any other man who attempts to lead the children of men astray from the oracles of God and from their duty.” (President Wilford Woodruff, **D&C, p.292.**)

Teaching false doctrine would surely be **leading people astray**, would it not?

Logical examination shows that Mormon doctrines, not just this one we are talking about here, but all of them may not have come from God at all, but are their own personal opinions or ***guess-work***. After all Joseph Smith had said, **“Some revelations are of God: some revelations are of man: and some revelations are of the devil.”** (*Comprehensive History of the Church*, vol. 1, p.163, as reported by David Whitmer, one of the witnesses of the Book of Mormon.)

Joseph Smith also had claimed, or should I say warned, that, **“Every man has a natural, and, in our country, a constitutional right to be a false prophet, as well as a true prophet.”** (Teaching of the Prophet Joseph Smith, p. 344.)

Warning by Isaiah 8:20 and 9:15b-16 declares, **“If they speak not according to this word, it is because there is no light in them...and the prophet that teacheth lies, he is the tail. For the leaders of this people cause them to err; and they that are led by them are destroyed.”**

Just as tails of scorpions hurt and cause damage (Rev. 9:10) so do the false prophets that lead their followers to destruction. We must encourage LDS people to do as the Bible commands: **“Study, to show thyself approved unto God.”**(2 Tim. 2:15.)

“Prove all things.” (1 Thess. 5:21.) **“Test the spirits because many false prophets are gone out into the world.”** (1 John 4:1; also 1 Tim. 4:1.) Their eternal destiny depends on that. They must forsake falsehoods and follow Jesus of the Bible (John 14:6), whose doctrines are unchangeable and whose **Word stands forever.** (Is.40:8)

Report of our discussion with an LDS man and my answer to his letter after that meeting:

(We had been asked by a young Christian man to meet with him and his LDS friend to discuss **what are the differences between Mormonism and biblical Christianity.** This young LDS man brought an older Mormon with him (maybe his bishop?). Had we known that he was coming too, we would have refused to have him join us. Our experience has shown that they will disrupt and not allow an open discussion. This 3-hour plus meeting did not go well. But the very next day we received a long letter from this “bishop”— and his continued arguments about the Bible. He even suggested that we’d meet again to hear more of his views of the Bible...

What we came to see during those many hours, is that *his Mormonism* is very different than what *orthodox Mormonism* we know is.

He, without knowing us at all, almost immediately after sitting down said to us (quite rudely, I may add) that Dennis and I *must have never been faithful Mormons with a testimony of the LDS Church*. In his letter the next day he continued in that same accusative tone and wrote: *“I suspect there is some un reconciled sins with the Lord, I suspect that perhaps there was a dismissal from church employment or great offense taken when counsel was given to repent. Pride affects us all, some to a greater degree. It is pride that will be the result of many that will find themselves short of their high aspirations... You are as many of your kind, ‘you can leave the church, but you can never leave it alone’ can you? This is because you know. You know full well what you are doing and have no desire to change your path. I am speaking bluntly of course, perhaps it offends you or you cant handle my directness...”* After saying that, he gave me a list of topics to answer.

[To make this shorter, I will just copy my responses, and hope that from my answers you can see what his topics/arguments were.]

I answered his letter and said:

We had understood that we were going to meet with two young men to discuss *Mormonism vs. Christianity.* You came unannounced and uninvited and you took over the entire discussion with your twisted interpretations of the Bible and did not allow us to show LDS leaders’ teachings

from their own books so that we could have compared doctrines and had a meaningful discussion. We wanted to show to these young men what the **leaders of the LDS Church, from Joseph Smith onward have taught on the subject of God, Jesus and salvation, but instead you wanted to show what you teach and believe.**

Mormon doctrine comes from General Authorities of the Church, not from individual members of the Church as you are. There are just about as many opinions about LDS doctrine as there are members of it, has been our experience. **That is the very reason why we only quote the high leaders, “apostles and prophets” of the LDS Church. We do not “interpret” what they say – we simply quote them!** Individual members’ beliefs or teachings are just opinions and not valid as a “proof” of doctrine.

It was on March 1, 2012, when **BYU religion professor Randy Bott** was publically rebuked (in SL Tribune) by the **high leadership of the LDS Church** about what he had said concerning doctrine **relating to blacks and the priesthood.** They made it known to him and to all others likewise, **that doctrine comes only from the Headquarters of the Church and not from BUY, not even from their religion professors.** Obviously you are *quite a bit lower on that totem pole* than BYU professors ☺ [no offence intended], **even though you did boast that no one knows doctrine as well as you know it!**

We will answer your arguments you sent in your letter, but we have absolutely no desire to meet with you again. You showed no desire to inspect Mormon doctrines vs. the Bible. Those over three hours with you were very revealing. When it becomes obvious that someone has firmly chosen false doctrines of Mormonism instead of the truth of the Bible, it is usually not productive to continue for it only results in *foolish arguments.* The Bible instructs us to *avoid them,* and also how to deal with a heretic: *“A man that is an heretic after the first and second admonition reject.”* (Titus 3:9-10.) We sympathized with your blindness at first, but soon realized that you have obviously chosen the lie (2 Thess. 2:10-12) and that the love of the truth is not in you. Arguing over your biblical misinterpretations was not taken us anywhere. We can only plead with you asking that you’d put away your pride and admit that Mormonism does not teach **belief in the God of the Bible, Jesus of the Bible, nor the gospel taught in the Word of God.** Refusing what the Bible says about these matters leads to eternal death.

You have no right to use the Bible by trying to twist the Word of God in defense of your beliefs in gods of Joseph Smith and his doctrines. LDS doctrine is not found in the Bible. The true Gospel is declared in 1 Cor. 15:1-4. Mormon-gospel is *“laws and ordinances of the LDS Church”* as stated in their 3rd Article of Faith. **That is not the Gospel of God.** *“But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost; In whom the god of this world hath blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.”* (2 Cor. 4:1-6.)

The Mormon-god is a former mortal man with gods above him, etc. (Mormon Doctrine, pp. 319-323.) Mormons are working for their own godhood, contrasting Isa. 43:10; 44:6, 8; Ps. 90:2 etc. **God of the Bible is Spirit.** (John 4:24.) **There is only one true God,** even *devils know that and tremble.* (James 2:19.) **Jesus of the Bible is God with us.** (Isa. 7:14; Matt. 1:23; John 1:1, 14; 8:23-24; Col. 2:9; 1 John 5:7; Rev. 1:8.) False gods, *“another Jesus”, “another gospel”* “witnessed” by *“another spirit”* cannot save anyone, no matter how many good works you do. (2 Cor. 11:4, 13-15; Gal. 1:8-9; Eph. 2:8-9.)

You said in your letter that you *“suspect”* that I was dismissed from church’s employment or that I was *“offended”* when *“counsel to repent was given”*. Where do you get that? You set yourself as a judge of us, but yet you do not know us. It is obvious that it is pride that drives you in your goal to godhood that Lucifer offered (Gen. 3:5) to those who obey him. You say that *our kind “can leave the church, but not leave it alone”!!* You obviously have no idea why we do this, and why we are willing to put up with abuse that we receive when we tell the truth, do you? The reason we are willing to talk with deceived people like you are is that it is God’s command to us. **We were once deceived by the Mormon Church. Mormons deserve to know the truth!**

What they do with it is not up to us to determine, but we must tell them. When we came to see the truth of the Bible and falsehood of Mormonism, we also learned that God commands His own to warn others so that they too could escape from destruction waiting for them if they do not come out from among them (2 Cor. 6:17) and leave behind the doctrines of men. (Ps. 118:8.) **“...the prophet that teacheth lies, he is the tail. For the leaders of this people cause them to err; and they that are led by them are destroyed.”** (Isa. 9:15b-16.)

Our kind and your kind are on opposite sides of the truth.

“Your kind”, I observe, is a person possessing same ambition for godhood as Lucifer does. (Isa. 14:12-14; Ez. 28:13-19.) As a temple-Mormon, you believe Lucifer’s promise of godhood he gave to those who obey him and disobey God, isn’t that true? (Gen. 3:5). That ***kind of a person*** can be the most prideful and arrogant, and also the most blind, for it is ***“the god of this world who has blinded the minds of them that believe not, lest the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them.”*** (2 Cor. 4:4; Col. 1:15.) This is acknowledged in the Mormon temple ceremony, namely that Lucifer is the ***“god of this world”***, and he is the one who (in LDS temples) instructs *Eve* how they can become gods. He speaks to *Eve* there as ***“her brother”***... but you, as a ***“temple-Mormon”***, know all that, so I do not need to say more. ***Your gospel*** (LDS ***“gospel”***) is false, and believing and preaching ***“another gospel”***, brings God’s curse. (Gal. 1:6-9.) ***Your “Jesus”*** is ***“another Jesus”*** and those who are following ***“another Jesus”*** are functioning under ***“another spirit”***. Influence of this ***“another spirit”*** was so obvious to us when we were watching and listening to you here on Monday evening. We felt very sad. **When Paul warned (2 Cor. 11:3-4, 13-15) about these another kinds, he also informed where these doctrines are coming from – from Satan himself. “For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into the apostles of Christ. And no marvel; for Satan himself is transformed into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also be transformed into the ministers of righteousness; whose end shall be according to their works.”** (2 Cor. 11:13-15.)

Becky and Sam, our new Christian friends (former LDS) are doing well regardless of the sadness that they also feel for their adult children who are not (yet) willing to consider what the truth about Mormonism is. They have studied the Bible daily, over 2.5 months now, since we first talked in the last week of January. They are excited to learn how true and great God’s Word is. It is amazing to see what the Lord can do in a short time when people are seriously seeking to know the Lord and have a desire to follow Him. We are confident that through all of your prayers for them and their children, the time of waiting will be cut shorter and they can again enjoy unity in their family with the true Jesus as the center of their lives.

We are asking prayer for Jim, who has found the Lord Jesus and is born again, but his family is not yet willing to listen. We also ask that you to pray for Lisa, her husband and young children

and for Kathy and her “very Mormon” husband. They are studying and willing to go with the truth. There are many more needing prayer but we cannot reveal their names yet, but the Lord knows who they are – just be in prayer for open hearts and minds and a continuing desire to be right with the Lord. We are so very thankful for these people that have courage to contact us – be it by email, letters or calls. That means that the Lord is seeing their pain and confusion and also their desire to know the truth and He is directing them to us – and also to many other ministries that are ready to help.
