It is hard to believe that it is December already. Our fall has been so warm and without snow that seasons from spring and summer through fall sort of seemed to run together – and now winter has arrived with snow! What a surprise!

We need to ask ourselves this question: What is the real meaning of Christmas to us? Is it gifts we give and receive? Is it decorations we bring out to brighten our homes? Is it special foods we prepare for friends and family? That might be all what the world sees in Christmas. The world even wants to eliminate the word “Christmas” and call it just a Holiday instead.

But what do we, as followers of Christ, think of this season?

We need to stop and ponder why we celebrate Christmas.

What made our salvation and our future in God’s Heaven possible?

It started with a promised Birth that was going to take place in a little town of Bethlehem, a promise written by Micah over 700 years before it happened.

“But thou, Bethlehem Eph-ra-tah, though thou be little among the thousands of Judah, yet out of thee shall He come forth unto Me that is to be ruler in Israel; whose goings forth have been from old, from everlasting.” (Micah 5:2.)

What the Old Testament has said for thousands of years became reality in the last part of September, 2 BC, *not in December*, when we and the world celebrate Christmas. Those who have studied this carefully from other known historical sources, pinpoint our Lord’s birth to the 29th of September, 2 BC.

Regardless of whether we know the exact birth date of Yeshua/Jesus, what is important to know is that He was born for us, and that we understand the profound importance of that fact.

Isaiah, who was related to the Royal Family of Judah, had recorded the life of king Uzziah in 2 Chronicles 26. Isaiah received his prophetic calling (Isa. 6:1) in the year when king Uzziah died (740 BC). The Book of Isaiah is a Messianic Book. We can learn more from Isaiah about our Lord Yeshua than even from the New Testament.

More than 700 years before the Birth of Christ, Isaiah wrote:

“For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder, and His name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace. Of the increase of His government and peace there shall be no end, upon the throne of David, and upon His kingdom, to order it, and to establish it with judgment and with justice from

henceforth even forever. The zeal of the LORD of Hosts will perform this.”

(Isaiah 9:6-7.)

Indeed, He is the mighty God. He is all that this verse says. In His first coming He came to offer salvation as God's gift to all who come to Him. When He comes again, He comes as a judge of the world that had rejected Him. He is the King of Kings and the Lord of Lords. (Rev. 19:11-16.) He will sit on David's throne, and rule forever and ever as was promised to Mary (Luke 1:31-33).

The world pictures Yeshua/Jesus as a physically beautiful man who gave to all who follow Him the gift of eternal life. He does give eternal life to all who come to Him for salvation, but we do not get the same picture as the world has of His person from Isaiah, who describes Him in these words:

“Who hath believed our report? And to whom is the arm of the LORD revealed? For He shall grow up before Him (the Father God) as a tender plant, and as a root out of a dry ground; He hath no form or comeliness; and when we shall see Him, there is no beauty that we should desire Him. He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief: and we hid as it were our faces from Him; he was despised, and we esteemed Him not. Surely He hath borne our grief, and carried our sorrows; yet we did esteem Him stricken, smitten of God, and afflicted.”

(Isaiah 53:1-4)

Isaiah continues: *“But He was wounded for our transgressions, He was bruised for our iniquities: the chastisement of our peace was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed. All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned every one to his own way; and the LORD hath laid on Him the iniquity of us all. He was oppressed, and He was afflicted, yet He opened not His mouth: he is brought as a lamb to the slaughter, and as a sheep before her shearers is dumb, so He opened not His mouth. He was taken from prison and from judgment: and who shall declare His generation? For He was cut out of the land of the living: for the transgression of My people was He stricken. And He made His grave with the wicked, and with the rich in His death; because He had done no violence, neither was any deceit in His mouth. Yet it pleased the LORD to bruise Him; He hath out Him to grief: when thou shalt make His soul an offering for sin, He shall see His seed, He shall prolong His days, and the pleasure of the LORD shall prosper in His hand. He shall see the travail of His soul, and shall be satisfied: by His knowledge shall My righteous servant justified many: for He shall bear their iniquities. Therefore will I divide Him a portion with the great, and He shall divide the spoil with the strong: because He hath poured out His soul unto death: and He was numbered with the transgressors; and He bare the sins of many, and made intercession for the transgressors.”* (Isaiah 53:5-12)

Let's look at this Messianic prophecy in Isaiah 53 a little closer: In verse 1, the question, *“Who hath believed our report?”* is presented as to draw attention to the lack of faith people will have in God's message. Messiah was rejected, His person was refused, and to human observation, Davidic line had ended, thus it was like *“a dry ground”*. His mission was misunderstood, He was humiliated, and they did not see *beauty* nor *comeliness* or anything *“kingly”* in His person for men to admire or *desire Him* (v. 2). Men want to hide their faces from His suffering and death which alone brings appeasement between God and man (vss. 4-6). He suffered death (vss. 7- 9), and He will be exalted. [The *“report”* in verse 1 is actually the gospel message that His apostles preached after *His death, burial and resurrection* – 1 Cor. 15:1-4, message that is still largely rejected.]

Some have argued that verse 5 means that He paid for our sicknesses and that our illnesses are healed through His suffering (v. 5). It does not say that. God can heal anyone He wants to heal, but there have been and are many faithful followers of the Lord who are not healed from their illnesses. What God has promised is to forgive our sins if we come to Him through Jesus, who paid for them! This verse says that He took God's wrath for all sin in our place. We receive spiritual healing and peace through His *“stripes”*. “He was wounded for our transgressions (our sins), He was bruised for our

iniquities (our wrong doings); *the chastisement of our peace* (peace that we lacked as sinners) *was upon Him; and with His stripes we are healed* (forgiveness gives us spiritual healing, which brings peace with God).”

When we carefully read all of chapter 53 of Isaiah, we can be assured that Yeshua/Jesus was *the Lamb of God who took away the sin of the world*. (John 1:29.) He went “*as a lamb to the slaughter*”, *He did not open His mouth* in His defense, because He went to the cross in our place and we were guilty - we all “*had gone astray*”, “*the LORD had laid on Him the iniquity of us all*”(vss. 6-7).

He was taken to an illegitimate trial, held in the middle of the night and He was “*cut off*”, He suffered a violent death seemingly by decisions of others – but the fact is that He willingly laid down His life for our sins (v. 8).

“*He made His grave with the wicked*”. He was crucified and He died between two thieves. “*and with the rich in His death*”, is a reference to His burial in a tomb of a rich man, Joseph of Arimathea (v. 9). Looking at verses 5 and 10 together makes it clear that Messiah’s death was according to the foreordained plan of God as the payment for *our iniquities*, so that we, who believe in Him, can *become children of God, His seed*, through our faith in His finished work for us. (John 1:12; Gal. 3:26-29.)

By our *knowledge* that involves our faith and acceptance of Messiah, we submit ourselves to the *righteousness of Christ*, who will “*justify many for He shall bear their iniquities*” (v. 11). His righteousness will then be applied to us even though we have no righteousness of our own. (Romans 10:1-4.)

This great chapter ends (v. 12) with glorification and exaltation of the Lord. (See also Philippians 2:9.) He “*poured out His soul*”, carries a meaning that He gave Himself, He died on our behalf. His “*intercession for the transgressors*” is a reference to His High Priestly work as our *one and only Mediator before the Father* (1 Timothy 2:5). Because of His atoning work for us, if we are in Him, we have guaranteed acceptance before God. Our salvation is secure. Praise be to our Lord.

Let us worship Him with true understanding of His love for us, and share the gospel of salvation with all whom we meet.

News from the Mormon Church:

November 8th, 2007, the LDS Church published a statement in the Salt Lake Tribune saying that they have changed one word in the Book of Mormon Introduction page. This is very significant admission that all LDS prophets from Joseph Smith to Gordon B. Hinckley have been wrong when they have insisted that all American Indians are Lamanites, descendants of Hebrews who left Jerusalem 600 BC and came to American Continent.

The Introduction page, written by late LDS apostle, Bruce R. MacConkie in 1981, said, “*After thousands of years, all were destroyed except the Lamanites, and they are the principal ancestors of the American Indians.*” The New version reads, “*After thousands of years, all were destroyed except the Lamanites, and they are among the ancestors of the American Indians.*”

With this change they are trying to minimize Lamanites to so small of a group that they cannot be found, implying that Lamanites are just “*somewhere among*” unknown groups...LDS apologists are now saying that there were a lot of other people in this land when Lehi and his family arrived. But the Book of Mormon says that this land (American continent) was “*kept from all other nations that they may possess this land unto themselves*”.(2 Nephi 1:9.)

At any rate, this change does not make a bit of difference, because the Title Page to the Book of Mormon says the same thing that the Introduction page said – connecting all Lamanites to the Hebrews. The Title Page says that the Book of Mormon “*is the record of the people of Nephi, and also of the Lamanites – Written to the Lamanites, who are remnant of the house of Israel...*” The LDS Church is trying to excuse this word change made to the introduction page on the ground that “*it was not part of original Book of Mormon*”, however, they

cannot remove the Title page, or make changes to it, because Joseph Smith said (as is recorded in the Times and Seasons, vol. 3, No. 24, p. 943), that “the title page of the Book of Mormon is a literal translation, taken from the very last leaf... of the collection or book of plates...this title page is not by any means a modern composition either of mine or any other man’s who has lived or does live in this generation.”

It is important to note that the Mormon Church has, from 1830 till now, taught, and Mormons have believed, that North American Indians (all of them) are Lamanites, described in the Book of Mormon as literal Israelites, and they, because they are Israelites, would initiate the building of the New Jerusalem on the American Continent, in the State of Missouri.

The late LDS prophet, Spencer W. Kimball, said, “Term Lamanite includes ALL INDIANS and Indian mixtures, such as the Polynesians, the Guatemalans, the Peruvians, as well as the Sioux, the Apache, the Mohawk, the Navajo, and others. It is a large group of great people...Lehi and his family became ancestors of all f the Indian and Mestizo tribes in North and South and Central America and in the islands of the sea” (Ensign, July 1971, p. 7, emphasis added.)

Gordon B. Hinckley, while speaking to an audience of about 28 thousand LDS people in Lima, Peru, emphasized the Book of Mormon heritage of his listeners when he said, “As I look into your faces, I think of Father Lehi, whose sons and daughters you are.” (Ensign, February 1997, p. 73.) [All LDS presidents and other General Authorities have made similar statements since the beginning of the Mormon Church, 177 years ago.] DNA studies, involving Indian tribes from Alaska to the South tip of South America during the last 20 years, have concluded that American Indians are Mongoloids from Siberia, and not Hebrews from Jerusalem. The LDS Church has claimed that their prophets (from Joseph Smith to Gordon B. Hinckley) are God’s modern day prophets who exclusively speak for God and that the Mormon Church is the only true church on the face of whole earth. The scientific research has proven conclusively that prophetic teachings of the LDS Church and the Book of Mormon are in error. If these leaders cannot be trusted in these issues, how can they be trusted in their teachings of God, Jesus and salvation, especially since the teachings of the LDS Church are in total opposition to the doctrine of the Bible and to the God of the Bible.

Nearly 100 years of scientific and archeological research has refuted all claims of the Book of Mormon that says that it is an actual history of millions of people who built magnificent cities, fought huge wars and had advanced culture.

For this we say unto you by the word of the Lord, that we which are alive and remain unto the coming of the Lord shall not prevent them which are asleep. For the Lord himself shall descent from heaven with the shout, with the voice of the archangel, and with the trump of God: and the dead in Christ shall rise first: then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up (in Latin: raptured) together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord. Wherefore comfort one another with these words.” (1 Thess. 4:13-18.)

An angry Mormon wrote:

Wow, you guys are screwed! You ought to be ashamed of yourselves. I just read your article "The Truth About Mormonism" that you guys wrote a few years back. I have to say that you are pathetic. Your scriptural references do not stand up to your arguments...they are all taken out of context. Honestly, what kind of satisfaction do you get out of producing slanderous tripe? Do you get paid for this stuff?...If you really are as you describe at the end of your article, I am truly sorry for you. You have left the only true church... I have a testimony that the LDS church is true, no matter what you try to prove...if you never were LDS, even if you say you were, then you can plead ignorance of the LDS religion...If you were LDS, then you better start repentance process..."

My reply:

Wow, is what I can say too. You write like most defenders of Mormonism – a lot of noise, but no specifics, no quotes or examples, just blanket statements and insults. Just so that you know, I/we have studied Mormonism from their own sources over 40 years. I base my testimony on facts, not on feelings. I have studied and tested all things as the Bible instructs, therefore I have no reason to be ashamed. (See: 2 Tim. 2:15; 1 John 4:1; 1 Thess. 5:21.) If you are in Utah, we welcome you to come and investigate the truth about Mormonism from their books. We have in our library hundreds of them.

After this life is over, it will be too late to think of changing your views. Eternal life is just that, eternal, and we cannot afford to be wrong in what the Bible says how we can get to heaven. My reply:

I was asked to reply to your letter. My name is Rauni Higley and I am a former Mormon.

I am very sorry that you feel the way you do. I see what you are saying in your letter **as evidence of a total lack of biblical knowledge** of who God is (and is not) and who Jesus is (and is not), and **what we, as Christians, are commanded to do**, when we face false religions and their teachings. We are simply responding to God's command, found in Jude 3, to "*earnestly contend for the faith that was once delivered to the saints.*" **We are contending for God's truth and defending the true gospel of Christ against false gospels.** The Mormon Church claims that the gospel was lost and that it was restored through Joseph Smith. **The biblical gospel was never lost.** It has been in the Bible that has been around for thousands of years, and truth and knowledge has been in it for anyone to find, learn and know. **What was delivered to the saints** (believers) **was what the Bible teaches, nothing added and nothing deleted.** (Rev. 22:18-19.) **Mormonism has added** 3 other books of scripture, temple rituals, genealogy etc. plus all their so called "modern revelations", given in their General conference talks. **Mormonism has deleted** the true gospel declared in 1 Cor. 15:1-4, which is *a message of death, burial and resurrection of Jesus*, and **added "laws and ordinances"**, among other things, to it, making the LDS "gospel" "*another gospel*", warned of in 2 Cor. 11:4, and in Gal. 1:8-9. There are no laws or ordinances in the gospel of Christ. The law cannot not save. (Read Gal. 2:16-21 – and the entire letter to Galatians.) Only Jesus saves (John 14:6; Acts 4:12.) Salvation is the gift of God, not of works. (Eph. 2:8-9.)

The Mormon Church has taken stories about Jesus from the Bible, but they have attached them to a totally different being, to "*another Jesus*", also warned of by Paul in 2 Cor. 11:4, and by Jesus Himself in Matt. 24:4-5. (Read also in Matt. 7:22-23 Jesus' warning to those who use His name, but do not KNOW HIM.) Mormonism teaches of another god, actually "gods", who are not Gods at all, but former mortal men who have supposedly progressed, evolved into godhood! Not true. God of the Bible is the only God – anywhere. He is God from "*everlasting to everlasting*" (Ps. 90:2), meaning that He never was less than God. **There are no Gods before Him, nor will men become Gods after Him, as is taught in Mormonism.** God of the Bible does not even know any other Gods. That is what the Bible teaches. (See Isa. 43:10; 44:6, 8.) The LDS Church teaches of *another Jesus* who is a created being, a spirit brother of all men and angels, including Lucifer. But Jesus of the Bible is **God Almighty with us** as Isa. 7:14 predicted and Matt. 1:23 affirms, as well as John 1:1, 14 and Phil. 2:6-7. **Jesus is God who created all things** – including Lucifer, and thus could not be his brother. (John 1:1-3; Col. 1:16.)

God of the Bible is Triune God, which means 3 equal, eternal Persons. **God is not a man.** (Numb. 23:19; Hosea 11:9; Isa. 31:3-4 etc.) Jesus, the Second Person in the Trinity, **became** a man for our sake. (John 3:16.)

There is only One God, and that One God is Triune God as 1 John 5:7 says: "**The Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, these three are One God.**" Jesus said that it is equal to eternal life to know God (John

17:3). We must know that He is God who came from heaven. John 8:23-24 declares: "Ye are from beneath; I AM from above: ye are of this world; I AM not of this world. I said therefore unto you; that ye shall die in your sins: for if ye believe not that I AM He (God), ye shall die in your sins." What Jesus is confirming here is that mankind did not preexist – **He alone came from heaven, we did not.** Men (all of them, of course) are "from beneath", from this world – all men are Adam's posterity until they are born again from the Spirit of God, and until they realize who Jesus is – that **He is the Great I AM, eternal God who is the Creator of all things.** Romans 9:8 says that *children of the flesh are NOT children of God.* We must accept Jesus, and believe that **He is God**, then we can **become God's children** (John 1:12.)

You say that you do not hear preaching from LDS pulpits about other faiths. They may not preach that now as often any more since they have **nearly 60 thousand missionaries** knocking on doors of Christians and telling them that **ALL other religions are wrong**, and not just a little bit wrong, but "**an abomination to God**". (See PoGP, Joseph Smith – History 1:19.)

There is no hope in false religions, nor in false gods nor in "*another Jesus*" – false gods will not save anyone – they simply do not exist, but are just imaginary beings.

Our purpose is to bring true hope to all who do not know the truth. WE ARE teaching of the true God, true Jesus Christ and salvation God offers to all repentant sinners. The Word of God, the Bible, was given so that we can test all things, as 1 Thess. 5:21 commands. We are to test the spirits (1 John 4:1) that give feelings and "testimonies" of falsehoods; we must compare all teachings to **the Bible, which is God's standard or the measuring rod for Truth.** "*All scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for instruction in righteousness.*" (2 Tim. 3:16.)

If we did not try to correct those who have departed from true God and His Word, we would have to answer to Lord God. **Ezekiel 33:7-9** instructs us and says that God has set His people, those who know Him, as *watchmen* over others, and **we must warn those who do not know God's truth. If we warn, but they do not heed the warning, we are no longer responsible – but if we do not warn, God holds us responsible for them.** You have heard the warning. Please pay attention to the Word of God, the Bible, and come and follow Jesus who is Almighty God. (Rev. 1:7.) He is coming soon.

There is no safety in following false prophets even though your leaders have assured you that "*the only safe course is to follow their prophets*". But "**prophets who do not follow true God and His Word can only lead their people to destruction.** Listen to what Isaiah said, "*...if they speak not according to this word (word found in the Bible), it is because there is no light in them..... the prophet that teaches lies, he is the tail. For the leaders of this people cause them to err; and they that are led by them are destroyed.*" (Isa. 8:20; 9:15b-16.)

Mormon leaders, as your Book of Mormon you quoted, may talk of "Christ", but **He is not the same one as found in the Bible.** Mormon-Jesus is Satan's brother. Jesus of the Bible is his Creator and the Creator of everything.

If you want to know the truth, then study the Bible and follow Him who is God and who can save you.
