H.I.S. Ministries August Newsletter, covering June-July 2009

Greetings and blessings of God to you all.

Our last newsletter was the June-July letter that reported about our ministry work in May. I did not write a monthly newsletter at the end of June as we normally do, for we had visitors from Finland, Marjatta and Leo, who came to visit us on the 25th of June. They stayed with us till the 12th of July. This was a very special time for both Dennis and I. We have not had people from my homeland visit us for 14 years. This visit was extra special for Marjatta is my childhood friend whom I have known since we were 12 years old. She was also an only child, as was I, and her mother was very good to me, since my mother had passed away when I was 11 years old.

During my visits to Finland over the years, a visit with Marjatta was always on my list of people to see while there. Dennis has also known her and her husband since 1976, when we visited them the first time together. That was when we were both still active members of the LDS Church, and Marjatta's mother was still alive. It is very interesting to recall that she tearfully asked me to help her daughter to become a believer in Jesus Christ. I promised I would do that! She did not know what Mormonism taught about Jesus and that the Jesus we then believed in was not the biblical Jesus, but a counterfeit. We did not then understand the deep differences between Mormonism and Christianity! I see now that it was a great blessing that I did not then even try to talk to her about my beliefs or try to convert her to Mormonism! [Marjatta's mother was a born again believer in Jesus Christ of the Bible. She had, already in the early 1960's, come to know the real Jesus in a personal and living way, while attending a Baptist revival that was brought to Finland by an American evangelist.]

Now, during Marjatta's and her husband's visit here, I was able to fulfill my promise to her mother, and talk to her about my faith in the true Jesus of the Bible. During these 3 weeks, I had many opportunities to talk to her about the Lord and His love and desire to have us come to Him for forgiveness and salvation. When they left, she promised to remember it all and act on what we had talked about. Praise God for His timing and giving me an opportunity to fulfill the promise I made to her mother over 30 years ago.

We are thankful to Mickey Hale for asking her son Eric to give us the use of his condominium in St. George and thus making it possible for us to take our friends to Southern Utah and show them our beautiful National Parks. In addition to these trips to South, Dennis made a two day trip with them to Yellowstone, while I took care of our ministry matters at home. Marjatta does not speak English, so the Lord really worked a miracle, for Dennis was able to speak Finnish to them all this time, even though it had been over 44 years since he was a Mormon missionary in Finland. They were amazed, as was I! Dennis was able to explain things perfectly **on any subject** - in Finnish!

We have a promise from God that through the Power of the Holy Spirit *we can do all things*. He reminds us of what we have learned, even a long time ago, just as we are promised. (John 14:26.) All who have

become God's children through a new birth can lean on the Holy Spirit and depend on Him in *our hour of need* – **what ever that need is**. Paul wrote to the Philippians (4:13), saying “*I can do all things through Christ which strengtheneth me.*” He anoints us for specific tasks that God has beforehand prepared for us to do (Eph. 2:10) so that we can serve the Lord effectively. This was a real testimony of the work of the Holy Spirit. It was kind of like the “*gift of tongues*” that God **can give** so that we can witness to **unbelievers**, if and when it is necessary. (1 Cor. 14:22.) We must depend on the Lord and follow His leading and direction at all time. There are no limits on what God can do through the power of the Holy Spirit, if we only are yielded to the Spirit of God, then we can be **filled with the Spirit and He will direct us in all we do**.

Through the power of the Holy Spirit we can truly have peace that passes all understanding. Even in the midst of sorrow and turmoil we can know that we are in the Lord's care. (1 Peter 5:7.)

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Some other news for you:

Our dear brother in the Lord, **Chris**, a former Mormon, to whom we had witnessed over 10 years ago, and **who has followed the Lord ever since**, called us in June, just a few days before our company from Finland arrived. He was thrilled that his wife, **Jamie** (still strong LDS), had finally agreed to come and talk to us – **after all these years!!** She had said that she “*just wanted to inspect Higley's LDS library*” and *see for herself* what Chris has been sharing with her over these many years, and **test if these things are so**. That is the only reason she wanted to come! **That is exactly what the Bible commands us to do! ‘Test all things’!** (1 Thess. 5:21.) Praise be to God that she now understood that, and wanted to personally find out.

I spent many hours *just handing her books* containing these topics she wanted to read. She had not wanted to “*hear it*” from me! But just before they were ready to leave, I went against her wishes and shared the truth about the biblical Jesus and salvation with her. **I said that without that Jesus, Jesus who is God Almighty (Rev. 1:8; John 8:23-24), heaven is not obtainable for her, or anyone for that matter.** (John 14:6; Acts 4:12.) After they left, I wondered if I had been too harsh... **But no, it was the uncompromised truth of the Bible that helped her to finally see what her husband had tried to share with her for these many years.**

I received an email from Chris exactly four weeks after their visit to our home. He wrote that Jamie has accepted the Lord Jesus and will be baptized on the 19th of July at South Valley Baptist Church, where we had, 1.5 years ago, taught a 10 week course comparing Mormonism and Christianity! Praise God for Chris, and also for Jamie and her courage to leave the LDS Church and join the body of Christ, the believers in the true Jesus.

We wanted to give our love and support to both Jamie and Chris and went to South Valley Baptist to witness Jamie's surrender of her life to Jesus and her willingness to publicly bear witness of her changed heart and her new birth that had taken place a few days prior to her baptism. As Romans 6:3-4 says, *she was now buried with Christ in baptism and raised to live her new life in Christ.* Jamie brought her LDS mother to witness her baptism! Another praise!!!

The 19th of July gave us even more joy – later that same afternoon, **Judy and Gene Parrish**, who had attended (last fall, Sept.-Nov.) our Mormonism classes at Calvary Chapel, were also baptized – in the Provo River. **Orem's EV Free Church pastor, Scott McKinney, stood in the cold Provo River and baptized over 40 people that Sunday. After he baptized Gene, then Gene baptized his wife, Judy. What a great day that was!!!**

While Utah celebrated the 24th of July, **Mormon Pioneer Day**, we celebrated our pilgrimage **from Mormonism** with 12 former LDS people, plus 2 other Christian couples, at Gary and Kay Brown's “vacation land” they own about an hour's drive from Orem, where they all live. Most of this group has attended our Mormonism classes and have become our dear friends in the Lord. Saturday we had another former LDS couple come from Spring City and enjoy dinner with us there. We stayed with Browns till

Sunday. What a great time it was to celebrate the Lord and His love and freedom He has given to us in Him. (John 8:30-36.)

From our mailbox:

A young LDS lady wrote:

I come from a family of Mormons. My parents divorced when I was about 5. My mother left the church for various reasons, and she has had nothing good to say about it ever since. Through my teen years I was a typical confused teen; when I visited my dad, I felt pull of the church and even enjoyed believing, but when I was with my mother, I lost interest quickly. Now my father has left the church, but his parents and some of the family on my mother's side are still members. I am not a member, and I have never been baptized. Now that I am older I have no interest in become one.

I am impressed with your research on Joseph Smith. It is good to read something that sounds a lot more credible than the stuff they say about him in the D&C, etc.

I was always told that he died as a martyr, but never knew what for. To learn the truth about him and his polygamy and his death was quite a jolt! It seems as though women were basically treated like "pick, choose and swap" – like they were property or whores. I always knew that Brigham Young was a bit shaky, but I did not know anything about his teachings of Adam being God and that God was first a man before he became a God. That sounds outrageous, and it blatantly contradicts the Bible!! How could they even try that? I think that most Mormons today have no idea of all this stuff! And isn't it funny how a lot of them have such a strong "testimony" that nothing anyone says or proves to them can shake it. It is admirable, but true? – no way!! And why do they want to believe that, when it is so obviously false? I know that if I showed your article from your website (www.hismin.com/AboutUs.htm) to any Mormon I am acquainted with, they would say "I know that the Church is true", and that would be that! Anyway, I just wanted to write you and let you know that I appreciate all the information you have written. I like that you gave facts to base it on, and not just speculations, like one article I read on ExMormon.org, where the fellow just said that "it is not true becoz there are too many spelling mistakes" and stuff like that. He may be right, but where's the proof? It was like reading an essay by someone who is trying to force his opinion on everyone... So I am glad yours was not like that. Thanks you for taking time to show the truth! Best regards. RH "

My reply to her was a simple "Thank you", and I also sent her links to articles that deal with issues that she seemed to be interested in (Adam-god and polygamy). I also encouraged her to go to the Bible and learn who the real God is, and know that there is salvation in Jesus Christ who is God, and that salvation is free gift of God to all who believe and accept the gospel (1 Cor. 15:1-4; Romans 10:9-10; John 3:16; 14:6; Eph. 2:8-9.) **We are praying for her.**

An RM, Returned LDS missionary, wrote:

"I just recently returned from my LDS mission. I looked at your site and found all kinds of accusations against the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints. I am sorry that you have feelings against the LDS Church. I have questions for you:

1. How did you come to the conclusion that Latter-Day Saints aren't Christian? Sure is funny, huh? I know what I believe and I do believe in the Lord Jesus Christ.

2. *How many Jesus's are there? The Scribes and Pharisees said the same thing to Christ and His Apostles. The LDS Church is going to grow regardless of all False accusations made against it. The work of God cannot be frustrated.*
3. *What does your husband do for living?*
4. *What does you pastor do for living?*
5. *Did you know that there are books missing from your Bible?*
6. *I guess you think that God does not speak to people today and that there are no more revelations. But isn't God same yesterday, today and forever? Know ye not that God speaks to more nations than one?*
7. *We believe that families are forever. We must do the temple work and other necessary works to make ourselves worthy of celestial kingdom - with our families, past and present. Actions speak louder than words, don't they? So you say that you believe in Christ and that makes you a Christian, but you do not have to follow his teachings? I got to go now and do some home teachings! CKM."*

My reply:

1. I came to this conclusion that Mormonism is not Christian by testing Mormonism against the Bible. I too **was** a Mormon missionary. I too talked about Jesus and even thought of myself as a Christian, even though at that time we were told by our Mission President that if we are asked, "*Are you Christians?*", we were to say, "*No, we are Mormons.*" Times have changed, have they not? Years later, however, when I started to earnestly study the Bible, in context, I found that no matter how often I had mentioned Jesus and even my faith in Him, the Jesus presented and talked about in and by the Mormon Church is not the same Person as Jesus taught about in the Bible. We must know the right One, as Jesus emphasized in John 17:3. ***Only by knowing the True God we can have eternal life.*** Being a Christian is much more than our behavior, even though Christian-like behavior is important too. Being a Christian means ***knowing personally the One who is the Truth and the Way and who alone gives Life.*** (John 14:6.) Name identification and even attaching some historical, biblical facts to a name Jesus, is not enough. ***We must know Him as Almighty God, who said, "I AM Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the ending, saith the Lord. Which is, and which was, and which is to come, THE ALMIGHTY."*** (Rev. 1:8.)

When Paul became a believer in Jesus, and that He is indeed Almighty God who came to save sinners, he was severely persecuted for truths sake. He asked: "***Am I therefore become your enemy, because I tell you the truth?***" (Gal. 4:16.) I am asking the same. All I want is to help you and all Mormons to see what the Bible says about God, Jesus and salvation.

As a Mormon you believe, as I too used to believe, that Jesus is not God Almighty, but a brother of all mankind and angels, including Lucifer. The reason why Mormons are not Christians is that they believe the false doctrines of Mormonism. It has nothing to do with how nice they may be, humanly speaking, but it has everything to do with their theology – the doctrine of Mormonism, that denies the absolute Deity of Christ. ***Christianity believes in Trinity (One Eternal God, which is three eternal, co-equal Persons), and in the Bible as the Final and Infallible Word of God, the only written source of knowledge of God.***

Mormonism denies all that, and as you know, Mormonism is a polytheistic doctrine, a belief in the existence of more than one God. Mormonism's core teachings are based on teachings of Joseph Smith and his additional scriptures.

2. Using the name of Jesus Christ, but not accepting Who He is, that He is God, does not make one Christian. Even though there is only one Real Jesus, there are many counterfeit-Jesus', whether you knew that or not. The Bible warns about different Jesus', "*another Jesus*" (2 Cor. 11:4; Matt. 24:23-24), and Jesus Himself said that **we must not believe them who teach a different Christ**.

Jehovah's Witnesses also say that they believe in Jesus Christ. They go knocking on people's doors around the world, just like Mormons do, presenting their version of Jesus – who, they say, is Michael the Archangel. Because they use the name Jesus Christ and present stories from the Bible to "prove" that they believe in Jesus, **would you say they are Christians**, when their Jesus is an Archangel, who became Jesus? What about Moonies? They too say that they believe in Jesus. Are they Christians? Muslims teach about Jesus too – would you say they are Christians? No, they are not Christians, neither are Mormons. **We must know Him, who He is, for He alone is God with us, He alone came from heaven, and He alone can forgive sins.** (Read: Matt. 1:23; John 1:1, 14; 8:23-24.) Those who have mistaken His identity, and not known Him as God, will eventually hear Him say to them, "*I never knew you, depart from Me.*" (Matt. 7:22-23.) Believing and worshiping "*another Jesus*" and other gods is against the First Commandment. (Ex. 20:3.)

3. You asked what does my husband do for living? I assume you asked because you think that we "earn" our living from our ministry? It would be nice, but we do not, even though we put 50-60 hours, and more, 6-7 days a week, into this work, and have been doing so about 25 years. After we left the LDS Church and lost our businesses, my husband has been working in home-remodeling and also building in his shop furniture for people. I am a Real Estate Broker, but for many years now I have considered ministry work without pay more beneficial for people than finding them homes to buy, and more rewarding for me spiritually than making money, so my RE work has been just part time for a long time. There is a joy unspeakable when someone sees the truth and comes to know the Real Jesus and is born again that no other work can give.

4. You asked also about our pastor (or pastors), and what do they do for living, again implying that they should not receive payment for their work as shepherds of their flocks. There are many factors that come to play in whether they are paid or not. If a pastor works full time for his church and his church is large enough to be able to provide income for their pastor, **he needs to be paid** just like any other worker. Paul said in 1 Cor. 9:14, "*The Lord hath ordained that they which preach the gospel should live of the gospel.*" Most pastors are men with families that they need to support and take care of their personal expenses. They, like all people, need to be compensated for their work. However, there are pastors that have only a small congregation and all the funds they can collect goes to paying rent for a meeting place, paying utilities of the church etc., then that pastor will not get a full salary, but has to find part time employment. We personally know pastors like that – one of them works with Dennis in remodeling jobs. The LDS people often mock paid Christian ministries as "hirelings", something that should not be done. **Do they not know that the Mormon Church pays salaries to thousands of people?** I too worked for the Church over 14 years, receiving a salary every month. Don't you know that the LDS Church has lawyers, PR people, accountants, clerks, secretaries, investors and other business people, also seminary teachers and directors, etc. – all paid employees? Did you not know that the General Authorities are also paid by the Church, and in addition to their compensation from the Church directly, many of them are also on the boards of Church owned businesses, getting paid by these businesses in addition to their salaries from the Church?

Mormon missionaries often brag about how they are not paid, but that they serve their missions *using only their own money*. That is not exactly true either. There are very few missionaries, if any, who could actually serve their full time missions from their own savings alone. **Most Mormon missionaries receive their funds from the LDS Church.** These funds are first sent to the Church, often by their parents or other supporters, so that they can get income tax deduction for these funds, just as other donations to the Church are also tax deductible. The Church then sends monthly portions of the funds to each missionary. Does that not make them being paid by the Church?

Today's LDS programs on a ward level are run by a bishop, who does not work full time for his ward, but delegates teaching and preaching etc. to the members of his ward to do. Thus he does not get paid, even though **D&C permits bishops being paid.** *“And the bishop, also, shall receive his support, or a just remuneration for all his services in the church.”* (D&C 42:73.)

5. You mentioned “missing books” from the Bible. **There are no missing books.** You may be thinking that just because the existence of some book or books is acknowledged in the Bible, these other books should have been included? No! Let's say, if you wrote a book about your life or any topic, and mentioned some books you have read, would they need to be included in your book? Of course not! The Old Testament was a complete canon, a collection of 39 books, about 400 years **before Christ**. It was translated from Hebrew into Greek about 270 B.C., the common language of the time – and it has all the same books we have in our Old Testament (OT) today. Jesus and His apostles, and all New Testament (NT) writers, authenticated the OT, without ever questioning its correctness or if it had all the books **intended** to be in it. (See: Luke 24:25-27, 44; John 5:39.) (The NT writers quoted from the **Septuagint**, the Greek translation of the OT.) The Bible itself is a library of 66 separate books, collected together for our learning. (Rom. 15:4.)

6. Are you implying that since there are no new books of scripture coming forth in our day, then God is not speaking any more? That is not so! God is continually speaking to His own from the pages of these 66 books included in the Bible. The OT is revealed to us in the NT - (i.e. interpreted, made more understandable, by the light and life of Christ). The NT says that there will be no more prophets as there were in the OT. (Matt. 11:13; Luke 16:16; Hebr. 1:1-2.)

God has given us all information in His Word, the Bible.

The NT explains the OT prophecies, and, as Hebr. 1:1-2 promised, Jesus revealed the future in the **Book of Revelation**. He takes us from the time when the Christian church is still here (Rev. Chapters 2-3), to *“after these things”* (4:1) through the **Great Tribulation** to the **Millennial Kingdom** (Rev. 19 and 20), and to the end of the world, when He makes all things new, a new heaven and a new earth (Rev. 21 and 22.)

What more could He tell us that He has not already?

Jesus warned about deception, false Christs and false prophets and told about the Great Tribulation (Matt. 24:4-5, 11, 21-25). Rev. 20:11-15 describes the **Last Judgment, the Great White Throne Judgment**, where **all unbelievers in Christ of the Bible** are judged by the Lord and sent to the Lake of Fire.

God indeed is the same yesterday, today and forever. The problem people have is that they are not interested in what God has revealed in His Word – they want “new prophets” to tell them what to believe and what to do. Studying is too hard for them! (2 Tim. 2:15; 3:16; 2 Pet. 1:21.)

7. **The work of God is belief in Him, that is, in Jesus.** (John 6:28-29.) **When we receive Jesus, we are born again, and in that instant we become sons and daughters of God** (John 1:12) and are **adopted into God's family.** (Romans 8:15.) We cannot “*join*” God's Family –

we must be born into it. (John 3:7.) **That Family of God, which is all born again believers in Jesus, is the only Eternal Family there ever is. If we have not received Jesus, we will not become God's children, nor will we be part of God's Family, nor will our names be written in the *Lamb's Book of Life*, but we will remain a part of the fleshly posterity of Adam, and the end there of is the lake of fire (Rev. 20:15.) – “*They which are the children of the flesh, these are not the children of God.*” (Romans 9:8, comp. John 1:12.)**

As Mormons we believed that in order to be going to the celestial kingdom, we must obey all “*the laws and ordinances of the LDS Church*” which included temple marriage, work for the dead, obedience to the leaders of the Church, etc., etc. We were taught in Mormonism that *salvation by grace alone* means just physical resurrection that Jesus provided for all people. We were also taught, and we believed that godhood and celestial kingdom has to be earned by our own works.

But the Bible is clear: “*Knowing that a man is not justified by the works of the law, but by faith of Jesus Christ...by the works of the law shall no flesh be justified...if righteousness come by law, then Christ is dead in vain.*” (Gal. 2:16, 21.)

Salvation is the gift of God: “*For by the grace are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the Gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast.*” (Eph. 2:8-9.)

After we were saved, we wanted to serve the Lord because He has given us His immeasurable gift of salvation. We want to do good – not to add any merits to our salvation by our own works, but to glorify Him for what He has already done for us. We do want to obey Him in love.

Please study Paul's letters to Galatians and Romans well. Maybe they will help you to see what the true Christian life is. **It is loving the Lord with all our heart, mind and soul, and our fellow man as ourselves, which means wanting to give our lives to the Lord, all of it, so that we can bring many to Christ who is the end of our own righteousness to all who believe.** (Romans 10:1-4.)

Jesus is God in human flesh. (John 1:1, 14; Matt. 1:23.) ***In Him dwells the ALL FULNESS of GODHEAD BODILY.*** (Col. 2:9.) **We must believe that He is God, otherwise our sins will not be forgiven.** (John 8:24.) **Only God can forgive sins.** (Mark 2:7.) **To go to heaven, our sins must be removed, washed away by His blood** (1 John 1:7).

May the Lord open your heart and mind to Him so that you can see how much He loves you: He died for you! (John 3:16.)

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I need to add an urgent prayer request for **Gene and Judy Parrish**, who, as I mentioned, were baptized just 2 weeks ago. Gene has had heart problems in the past – he has had a stent put in his heart some time ago, but when he went to see his doctor last week, they discovered that he needed immediate surgery.

His heart needed 6 by-passes. As I write this, he is already through surgery that seemed to have gone well, except that they could only do 4 bypasses, for two of his arteries were too blocked. Please pray that his heart will function properly in spite of this set back and that he will get through the healing process with the least amount of discomfort. Please pray also for their finances to take care of huge expenses resulting from this and also for Judy's strength and peace. They are strong people in the Lord.

We all need to continue in prayer for **Heidi Albiston**. Heidi's situation with her cancerous brain tumor is still life threatening. She has not improved after the Lord miraculously healed her right eye so that she could see again. Regardless of her current situation, we know that the Lord loves her and He has His purposes hidden in this trial - we will find it out in His time. Heidi's husband, Dave, had a severe case of

pneumonia about 6 weeks ago and was hospitalized in the ICU, but he is doing better now. He has at least 4-5 more weeks before he is recovered completely. Their young children are staying amazingly strong through all this.

Dale, a sweet and super friendly brother in Christ from Calvary Chapel, was, about 3 weeks ago, riding his motorcycle, and was hit by a car that ran a red light. Dale is in very serious condition and has been in the ICU ever since the accident. He has gone through several surgeries already, and his wife was told that if he recovers, he will be paralyzed from his waist down and will not have more than perhaps 20% use of his arms. Dale is a joy to know – he is the most positive man we have ever met – always having something wonderful to share with a big smile on his face as he greets people. Please pray for him and his wife – they have only been married about 3 years. This is very hard for her.

We have mentioned **Bruce** often in our newsletters and asked prayer for him. We praise God that his cancer is in remission. However, his heart is burdened for his children and he is asking that we not only pray for his health and other issues he is struggling with, but that we pray for salvation of his children and grandchildren.

Bruce is hoping that his struggles with the insurance companies will soon be over and settled. [Bruce was in a serious car accident (not his fault) that happened several years ago, a short time after he had accepted the Lord and left the LDS Church. Makes one wonder how much the enemy of our souls wants to hurt us even when he can no longer *get us!*] This accident left him unable to work, and it has taken these many years to even get his case to court. It seems that Insurance Companies, more often than not, are “good” only until you have a claim to present. They have dragged on and on with this matter – not wanting to settle. We are praying that the Lord will trouble the decision makers in these insurance companies so that they will finally agree to do what is right.

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We received a letter from **Michael and Lynn Wilder**, parents of this great band of their son(s) asking that we inform our readers and friends about **Adam’s Road** coming events in Utah. We had them here 2 years ago, and enjoyed them tremendously. God is good!

Adam's Road Ministering in Utah from August 29 through September 26th.

Adam's Road, the Christian band started by five former LDS young men (four of whom served LDS missions), will be back in Utah touring August 29 through September 26. Theirs is an amazing testimony of what God did first in the life of Micah Wilder who became born again in Christ while on his Mormon mission to Orlando Florida 2004-2006; in the life of his brother Matt Wilder; his brother-in-law, Joseph Warren; another Florida missionary from Seattle, Steve Kay; and former Mormon Jay Graham, who comprise Adam's Road. Their fervor for God's Word is contagious. Even the Wilder parents have left religion for a relationship with Jesus Christ; Micah's mom was a tenured professor at BYU. She and Michael now reside in Florida.

Adam's Road has been playing in churches near the Nauvoo and Palmyra pageants this past month and witnessing to people attending the pageants. The band is looking forward to their time in Utah to sing praises to God for what He has done and to teach Biblical truth. Please come out and support them.
