Newsflash: The Washington D.C. Mormon temple held three-day rededication sessions on August 14, 2022

This temple has been closed for 4 years for renovation. On this day president Russell M. Nelson of *The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints* prayed, "*We ask Thee to accept this house as our offering to Thee and Thy Son as a place worthy of Thy holy habitation.*" Prophet Nelson continued and said, "*...temples and temple covenants have always been important to God and His covenant people... Adam and Eve, Abraham and Sarah, Lehi and Sariah [of the Book of Mormon] all made covenants with God as we do today.*" Nelson really said that!

The prophet and president of the Mormon Church had obviously missed what the Bible says about *God's habitation in temples*: "*The Most High does not dwell in temples made with hands.*" (Acts 7:48.) The Bible also informs us (1 Cor. 3:16-17) that *God dwells in the hearts of the true believers in God* instead of in buildings.

However, before the temple that Solomon built (1000 B.C.) for God in Jerusalem (1 Kings 8), there were no temples built for God of Israel. Israel, in their wilderness wandering, was told by God to build a movable Tabernacle (Ex. 35:4-9, 10-19) for worship, and that later became a model for the temple in Jerusalem.

Solomon's Temple was for sacrifices, not for endowments and marriage ceremonies. Temple grounds were literally slaughterhouse yards: "*Then the king and all Israel with him offered sacrifices before the LORD. And Solomon offered a sacrifice of peace offerings, which he offered to the LORD, twenty-two thousand bulls and one hundred and twenty thousand sheep...*" (1 Kings 8:62-63 and continuing.) Mormons often assume that what is going on in the LDS temples is what had taken place in Solomon's temple. Comparing what took place in Solomon's temple has no connection or similarities to ceremonies or covenants taking place in any of the 167 currently functioning Mormon temples, including the DC temple (or what will take place in 51 more temples that are under construction).

The living are going to the Mormon temples to be married for eternity in order to qualify to become gods, and/or to do "work of the dead".

The only temples that the Bible mentions **before Solomon's temple**, are temples built for various pagan gods, as for the Canaanites' gods (in Book of Judges 16) and for the Philistines' gods (in 1 Sam. 5.)

God had made a covenant to His people Israel, and they were told not to mingle with idolatrous inhabitants of the land. It is impossible to be joined to God and to idols. (1 Cor.10:20-21; 2 Cor. 6:14-18; Ezra 10:11.)

Mormon Temple-goers are acting "*as mediums through which living can hear from the dead, and that heaven and earth and the world of spirits may commune together.*" The fundamental truth of why Mormon temples are built is "*That the living may hear from the dead.*" (LDS Apostle Parley P. Pratt, 4/6/1853, Journal of Discourses, vol. 2:44-46.)

This is occult practice, *necromancy*, forbidden by the God of the Bible. (Deut. 18:10-12.)

The LDS temple ceremony uses the same wording as is used in Masonry and Magic ceremonies. There is ample evidence to prove that Joseph Smith stole the temple endowment from Masonry that pre-dates Mormonism.

Official LDS Church history confirms that *Joseph Smith had become a Master Mason on Wednesday, March 16th, 1842.* (Hist. of the Church, vol. 4:551-552.) It was Joseph Smith himself who informed that *he taught the Endowment ceremony first time to his apostles on Wednesday on May 4th, 1842*, in the upper room of his "*red brick store*", which was less than 2 months after receiving his Master Mason degree.

In the *Scottish rite Freemasonry* men are anointed as "*Priests after the order of Melchizedek, as are Mormon men who are considered worthy. The secret handshakes and rituals taught in the Mormon-temples, are, in most cases, identical to those in Freemasonry.*" Most of the early leaders of the Mormon Church were also Masons (I have a list of 22 of them) in addition to about 1,300 other Mormon men.

The "Five points of Fellowship" is a body stance that initiates assume in the temple when receiving the Name of the Second Token of the Melchizedek Priesthood. (It is identical to the *Five Points of Fellowship* with which the initiate receives the ultimate secret of the 3rd degree of *Blue Lodge Masonry*.)

Similarities are enough to see that Joseph Smith copied them from Masonry, as even LDS Historian and Institute Director, Dr. Reed Durham, has shown. To this day, some Masonic scholars consider Mormon temples to be "*clandestine Masonic lodges*" (meaning illegally constituted).

This is the same occult practice (*necromancy*), forbidden by God of the Bible. (Deut. 18:10-12.)

[Today's Mormon temple rituals are in addition nearly identical to Wiccan ceremonies in that they also teach "*eternal marriage*", "*plural marriage and evolution to godhood ("eternal progression"*, as it is called in Mormonism). *It is similar also to witchcraft.*]

The **DC Mormon temple** was built in the early 1970's and completed and dedicated for use in 1974. I recall, during at that same time in 1970's, when I and a few other language translators were called to work in the SL Temple, translating "*all what is going on in there*" i.e. *all temple ordinances, rituals, endowments and sealings*, there was a lot of talk among Mormons about *Joseph Smith's prophecy*, of "*One Mighty and Strong*", who, he had said, *is going to be a Mormon Elder, who would save the United States from destruction.* During that time, and among certain LDS circles, there was also a talk about that *the DC temple was being built for this coming Mormon leader/president in mind, and that this temple is going to have, for his convenience, on the upper floor a replica of the Oval Office in the White House.*

I have a later quote from a former LDS member referring to this DC temple. He wrote, "*I can tell you that the DC temple was my temple when I was a Mormon, and I know that we were told by our bishop that there was a room in the upper levels of the temple which was designed to be an exact replica of the Oval Office in the White House from which a future prophet could rule over the USA. I also know from actually being in the temple on many occasions that there are whole floors of the temple which are locked away from even temple-recommend holding Mormons...*"

The Salt Lake Mormon temple's upper floors are also guarded, and if anyone needed to go past the main floors, he/she had to have a special written permission, in addition to a regular temple-recommend. When I was working there, our assigned room for translation work was on the 5th floor, called "*The Talmage room*", where Apostle James Talmage wrote his books, "*Jesus the Christ*" and "*The Articles of Faith*". That room is right behind the *Great Assembly Hall* that was built exactly like a *Masonic Lodge, the Melchizedek Rostrum* to the West and *Aaronic Rostrum* to the East. This *Assembly Hall* is the one where the Church holds *rare and special Priesthood Meetings*, called a *Solemn Assembly*, where apostles of the Church serve the sacrament to the attendees. (It was also in the early 1970's, and when Dennis was an Elder's Quorum President, that he also received an invitation to one of these special meetings.) [SL Mormon Temple exhibits earlier Kirtland and Nauvoo temples' Masonic designs. The outside of both Nauvoo and Salt Lake temples also display other Masonic symbols.]

We have been asked to remind all of you who are willing and wanting to share the message of salvation with any unbelievers or the members of the Mormon Church, and how to best do it. We really do not claim to have any formula for that. What would be helpful to know though is at least some of the basics of what those, who you are wanting to share with, actually believe. A majority of them are perhaps Mormons, some active and “temple-endowed”, some inactive and unbelieving LDS church members, etc. Where they are in their current faith or lack of any faith may determine where to begin. We need to keep in mind that according to LDS statistics, only about 10-15% of all Mormons have been even once “*through the temple*” (i.e. *received their endowments*). Some have done it only just before going on the mission or *getting married in a temple*, most under parental pressure. From their activity level you may be able to determine what they may know of their own religion, or if they even care.

However, you do need to know and understand what the Bible teaches about God, Jesus and salvation. Knowing who God is, knowing who Jesus is, and IS NOT, is what you must know, for there are many false Christs presented by various cults and religions. They all use the same name, “Jesus Christ”, but his person, who he really is varies from cult to cult. We have, in our nearly 40 years of ministry, learned that talking about *prophets, visions or priesthoods, etc.* like Mormonism presents, is a long road that takes a lot of time and does usually and eventually lead to a DEAD END. It is always best to clear the first things first, i.e. WHO IS GOD? WHO IS JESUS? HOW CAN A PERSON BE SAVED, AND AFTER THIS LIFE, GO TO HEAVEN RATHER THAN TO HELL? IS THIS EVEN POSSIBLE TO KNOW?

Just below, in this letter we are attempting to present these issues – and if you have questions, we are willing to talk with you. At the end of this newsletter we give information on how to contact us – by email or by phone , or making an appointment to come and see us in person.

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The Mormon Church in these days is adamantly *claiming to be a Christian church*, the same as other Christian churches, *only better*, they say, for “*they have a living prophet and continuing revelation from God*”.

The New Testament tells us that the time of the prophets ended in John the Baptist (Matt. 11:13), who came in the Spirit of the Old Testament prophets to remind the Jews what their prophets have told about the coming of the Messiah and King. *Letter to the Hebrews* (Jews) tells that God is not speaking to people any more through the prophets, but that He now speaks only by His Son. (Hebr. 1:1-2.) Russell Nelson, the current *living prophet of the LDS Church*, has announced that they should not be any more called “Mormons or LDS” but “Christians”, because their church is a Christian Church. Therefore witnessing to Mormons (that they, by their beliefs, are) has become a bit more complicated than it was some years ago. (When we were Mormon missionaries (in the mid-1960’s), our Mission President instructed us to say just the opposite. He said, “*If people ask are you Christians, you have to say ‘No, we are not Christians, we are Mormons’.*” He explained why by saying that during Joseph Smith’s “*first vision account* “ Joseph had asked the Lord “*which of the Christian sects (denominations) is right and which one he might join, the Lord had answered him saying that they are all wrong and their creeds are an abomination in His sight and those professors (those who profess belief in them) are all corrupt*” (PoGP, J.S. Hist.1:19) thus we were told not to connect us to so-called Christianity, “*for we are Mormons and we believe in the Book of Mormon, and also the Bible where it is translated correctly*”.

We are often asked how one can begin talking about faith with a Mormon who says that he/she believes the Bible, but obviously, more often than not he does not know much about its context other than perhaps a few repeated verses that the LDS Church has seen fit to use. This unfamiliarity about the Bible, in most cases, may be a result of *the Articles of Faith* (their *Creed or confession of faith*) that says that Mormons “*believe the Bible, as far as it is translated correctly*”. An average person is not able to know which parts are or are not correctly translated, thus they naturally skip studying the Bible and read the Book of Mormons instead, for they are told that it is correct. Since the Mormon Church has not informed what is not correctly translated in the Bible, Mormons assume that where the Bible opposes or does not agree with Mormon teachings, it is the Bible then that is not correct.

When talking with a Mormon about faith in God, it is helpful to know what they have been said about the Bible, for *in contrast to the BoM “translation”*, the Bible translations can be verified, for the Hebrew text of the OT and Greek text of the NT are available to inspect, if needed. Now that *Mormons say that they are Christians*, we should be able to talk about the most important matters of faith (God and Jesus) and see what they mean when they say that they are Christians. They can be Christians only if they believe what true Christians believe about God, Jesus and salvation.

Jesus emphasized in His prayer (John 17) what is the most important thing to know: **“This is eternal life that they may know You, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom You have sent.”** (John 17:3.) He means what He said: **In order for you to have eternal life you must know the only true God, and who He is, and Jesus Christ whom He has sent.**

Therefore you may start your discussion by asking; **“Would you tell me about God the Father you believe in? And also, “What do you know about Jesus and His birth? Whose Son is He?”** If they would honestly tell you what they have been taught about God, they would say what **God was once a mortal man as we are now, and Jesus, his eldest son, was born in the preexistence as we all were. He is our elder brother, who was later begotten in flesh by our Immortal Heavenly Father, same way we are begotten by our earthly fathers.** From this you can see that **God, believed among Mormons, is not uncreated, eternal God who is Spirit. Jesus’ birth is told in Matthew 1:18-23. He is not a brother of mankind, but God who became a man to die for our sins,** as the Bible teaches. When you then explain what the Bible teaches about God and Jesus, it should open their eyes to see that **there are huge differences between our “Christian” faiths.** At this point you can open the Bible and show what the Word of God says about who God is and who Jesus is.

The Bible teaches about **Triune God, three Eternal Spirit Persons** (the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit). **One of them, the Son, became a man to save us by dying on the cross for our sins.** The Bible tells us that Jesus is **“Immanuel, God with us”** (Matt. 1:23); **“He is God the Word”** (John 1:1-3, 14); **“He is the image of the Invisible God”**, and that **“by Him all things were created that are in heaven, that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him.”** (Col. 1:15-16.) **That is the Jesus who alone can save.** (John 14:6.)

We must be aware that there are other’s presented by that same name, but not by His true identity, **which is God.** Paul wrote, **“If he who comes preaches another Jesus, whom we have not preached, or if you receive a different spirit, which you have not received, or a different gospel which you have not accepted you may well put up with it...For such are false apostles, deceitful workers, transforming themselves into apostles of Christ. And no wonder! For Satan himself transforms himself into an angel of light. Therefore it is no great thing if his ministers also transform themselves into ministers of righteousness, whose end will be according to their works.”** (2 Cor. 11:4, 13-15.) Paul continued his warning in Galatians 1:8 and said, **“Even if we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel to you than we have preached, let him be accursed.”** What was the Gospel that Paul and other apostles had preached? It is recorded in 1 Cor. 15:1-4, where Paul said, **“I declare to you the Gospel which I preached to you, which you also received and in which you stand, by which also you are saved... that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, and that He was buried and that He rose again the third day according to the Scriptures.”**

“The gospel” of the Mormon Church is not it! Their **Third Article of Faith** says that **“...all mankind may be saved by obedience to the laws and ordinances of the Gospel.”** There are no laws of ordinances in the Gospel of God! The Gospel is a message of what Christ did for us on His Cross: **He died and was buried and He rose again, all according to the Scriptures!** When we believe that, **we are saved and stand on that promise.** **“For by grace are you saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast.”** (Eph. 2:8-9.) Salvation indeed is the gift of God, received by His grace, not by works of any kind (nor by laws and ordinances).

This should open the door to tell more about the Bible that God has given to us in order that we can know and be saved! **The Bible is the Only Book of God in the entire world** and it (both Old and New Testament) was **given by inspiration of God for doctrine and for correction.** (2 Tim. 3:16.)

The Bible is not just one book, but it is a Canon (collection) **of 66 books.** The Old Testament has **39 books** written by God’s prophets during 1500 years of time, revealing **God’s plan for mankind’s redemption through Messiah/Christ.** The New Testament has **27 books** that are **testifying of the coming of Christ,** and what the OT has said about God, Jesus Christ and salvation of mankind. These 66 books tell it all, from Genesis through Revelation; from the beginning **to the coming of His final earthly Millennial Kingdom** (Rev. 20:4) and **the Great White Throne Judgment of unbelievers.** (Rev. 20:11-15.) After that God makes all things new. (Rev. 21 and 22.) It is all told so that everyone can come to know and be saved. **God did it. There are no other books of God!** All other books are false even if they are claimed to be from God.

We’d like to advice those who have never really studied the Old Testament, to **at least read an OT summary of God’s plan for Israel, from Abraham to Christ, in Acts 6:8-16 and continuing Acts 7:1-60.** It was given by Stephen, the first Christian martyr, just before he was stoned to death. Reading Stephen’s address from the **calling of Abraham,** makes it easier to understand the New Testament better, for all NT writers have quoted from the OT (Septuagint) and reading

this we can come see how important the OT is for us too. Some say that we do not need to study the Old Testament anymore, **but we do! Without studying the OT we can never really get it, but Stephen's OT summary will surely help.**

The New Testament begins with four gospels, the Life Story of Jesus Christ, written to four separate groups of people. Matthew wrote to the Jews, who were waiting for their promised King who had to be qualified by his genealogy to that role. He begins with **Abraham, the father of Jewish nation, and showed that Jesus is the one who is "*the Son of David*". Mark wrote to the Romans, and he presented Jesus as *a suffering servant* (no genealogy required for servants). Luke wrote to the Greek (gentiles) and he presented Jesus as a man, **Second Adam**, beginning his genealogy from Adam. John wrote to all people, both Jews and Gentiles, presenting Jesus as **who He really is, God who became a man** (John 1:1-3, 14) and **that He died for all who will receive Him, and by so doing become sons of God.** (John 1:12-13; 3:7.) The Acts begins with the ascension of Jesus (1:9-11) with the promise of **His return in the Clouds, just the same way as He left.** (1 Thess. 4:16-17.) **Acts 2:1-3 tells of the coming of the Holy Spirit and the Birth of the Church**, which soon began to grow. **Acts 6:8-16; 7:1-60 tells of God's call to Abraham and the story of Israel from Abraham to Christ**, followed by conversion of Saul and *becoming Paul* who with Barnabas started to spread the gospel from Jerusalem onward.**

The rest of the New Testament presents epistles (letters) of Paul, Peter, John, James and Jude (brothers of Jesus). These all teach Christian doctrine (2 Tim. 2:15; 3:16) and give instructions for an effective Christian life.

The Book of Revelation is the Revelation of Jesus Christ (Rev. 1:1), written down by Apostle John.

It is the last book of the Bible. God had informed us (Matt. 11:13) that after John (the Baptist), there are not going to be any more prophets as in the OT. "God, who at various times and in different ways spoke in times past to the father by the prophets, has in these last days spoken to us by His Son..." (Hebr. 1:1-2.)

In Rev. 1:2-3 Jesus tells about seven churches, similar to the churches today and the church age we are still living in. The church began all of a sudden (Acts 2:1-3) with the coming of the Holy Spirit, and it will also suddenly vanish by the Rapture (1 Thess. 4:13-18) **by which the Church is removed from the earth. Revelation is a "book of prophecy", given by Jesus, telling what will take place after the church age (the Rapture).**

Chapter 4 begins with Greek words, "Meta Tauta", meaning "after these things", and from that point on we are presented what will take place during the 7-year Tribulation (Matt. 24:21) and continuing through chapter 19.

After the official Second Coming of Jesus Christ (to Jerusalem), Satan is bound for 1000 years and Jesus establishes the Millennial Kingdom (20:4) and reigns thousand years with His Saints. After the thousand years are over, Satan is released, and he again deceives all nations to go against God. But that does not last long. "And fire came down from heaven and devoured them." (Rev. 20:7-10.) Next is the **Great White Throne Judgment. That appointment is set for all unbelievers from Genesis till that day.** (Rev. 20:11-15.) After that God will create a new heaven and a new earth (chapters 21 and 22) **followed by believers' eternal life with God, forever and ever. Hallelujah!**

The Bible is all that is needed for mankind to know how to be saved. The New Testament testifies of the Old Testament and tells the Story of redemption by Jesus Christ. The Bible is a proven history, both archeologically and prophetically. It can and it has been verified! The Bible tells about real people, real places and about real God and His love for people that are now or will become His own.

Jesus, the Word that became flesh, He has told it all. By studying *His Word*, we can see that God has not left anything untold. Just as Amos 3:7 says, **"Surely the LORD God does nothing unless he reveals His secret to His servants the prophets."** All main events that have taken place and will still happen on this earth, from the Book of Genesis through the Book of Revelation, from the Creation to Eternity, **they are told in His Holy Word, the Bible.** Jesus being *the Word that became flesh and dwelt among us* (John 1:1-3, 14) **is He who holds it all together till the End.** (Col. 1:15-18.)

Anyone who adds any words or any other books as from God, or takes away or changes God's Words written in His Book, the Bible, will receive what Revelation 22:18-19 says: "IF ANYONE ADDS TO THESE THINGS, GOD WILL ADD TO HIM THE PLAGUES THAT ARE WRITTEN IN THIS BOOK; AND IF ANYONE TAKES AWAY FROM THE WORDS OF THE BOOK OF THIS PROPHECY, GOD SHALL TAKE AWAY HIS PART FROM THE BOOK OF LIFE, FROM THE HOLY CITY, AND FROM THE THINGS THAT ARE WRITTEN IN THIS BOOK." [That saying applies to Joseph Smith and all other false prophets that have come into the world. (Matt. 24.)]

We are very thankful to you, **our friends and supporters**, for you have shown to us what the true believers in Christ will do when troubles come to one of His own, as now to us, when our hearts seems to break and sleep does not even come to give us rest. **Your phone calls, cards and letters have warmed our hearts and given us determination to accept what cannot be changed.** We trust that the **Lord knows why now** this has happened, and **He again promises** that ***“all things work together for good to those who love God, to those who are the called, according to His purpose.”*** (Rom. 8:28.) We have looked at this promise again, over and over, and repeated to ourselves what we understand from this verse, at this time. ***This is what we see: Yes, we truly love the LORD, our God,*** and we ***KNOW that He had called us*** out of Mormonism. And ***we KNOW that He schooled us*** while we were yet ***“true believers in that cult and what it teaches”***, (we didn’t then know that we were in God’s school). ***It took Dennis 40 years and me about 20 years to learn and experience what we know about Mormonism, and what was necessary for us to learn while we were true and trusted insiders of this cult.*** That experience has made it possible for us afterwards to do and be ***the called, according to His purpose.*** We also realize that when this part of our schooling was over was when ***He led us into His Word and in-depth studying it*** – yet then we did not know why. ***After we had received the LORD and His Holy Spirit,*** He started to show us ***why our lives had been so full of unanswered questions and much confusion.*** These indeed were part of ***“all things”*** that God had made to ***“work together for good”.*** What we can say from our whole heart is that ***WE LOVE THE WORD OF GOD, “from Genesis through maps”!*** (the Book of Mormon does not have maps!)

You may have seen two names, Greg and Lisa, in our prayer list recently. Greg got very ill all of a sudden and regardless of medical care and prayers, he passed away on August 20th, 2022. Greg and Lisa have been our dear friends since 2004 when they attended one of our 10-week classes of *Understanding Mormonism* at Calvary Chapel, where we were teaching.
